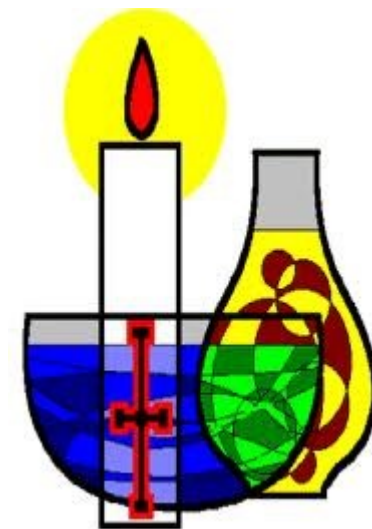
11TH SUNDAY OF PENTECOST (5TH AUGUST) THEME: ONE BODY & ONE SPIRIT
