

THEME: Our Help is in the name of the Lord

Reflection

The book of Esther explains why Jews in the Persian period began celebrating the new festival of Purim. The law of Moses had earlier described how God's mighty acts of deliverance lay behind holidays such as Passover and Tabernacles. The book of Esther shows how God intervened once again to save the Jews, leading to the commemoration of this great rescue in the feast of Purim.



This fast moving story occurs during the reign of the Persian King Xerxes or Ahasuerus (possibly Xerxes I, 486-465 BC). It relates the adventures that take place when a Jewish exile named Esther and her cousin and guardian, Mordecai, work to rescue their people from a plot to destroy them.

Whilst the book of Esther, strangely, makes no mention of God by name, the presence of God's protection underpins the story. The words of today's psalm sum up the faith of Esther and Mordecai: "Our help is in the name of the Lord" *Ps 124:6*

Today we acknowledge God's help for us in all situations of life, and inspired by Jesus' words in the Gospel, we know that God's help can also work through us, even in the smallest deeds of kindness.

From Esther's Prayer (*Additions to the book of Esther 14:14—O.T. Apocrypha*)

**Save us by your hand, and help me,
who am alone and have no helper but you, O Lord.**
