Reflection

The next four weeks we have Old Testament readings from the book of Job. This piece of Wisdom Literature is an extended reflection upon why bad things happen to good people. It is a monumental book of 42 chapters. Today at its beginning, the 'court room' drama is established as "The adversary" (in Hebrew *Satan*) questions God as to whether Job is really as good as he seems. He is given free rein to test Job's faith. Job's response is to stay faithful to God throughout his suffering. There is a complexity to the book of Job that defies easy summation here, but its deep themes of unjust suffering and enduring faithfulness are ones we can all relate to.

When we couple this theme of unjust suffering to the Gospel reading about the children coming to Jesus, it is a very fitting day to launch our Operation Christmas Child appeal. This year we will once again fill shoeboxes of love to support this appeal. Boxes and information leaflets are available
