All Souls Day (usually Nov. 2) is the day in the church's year when we commemorate and give thanks for those dear to us who have died (particularly in the past year) and to pray for them and their families. Our practice, like many churches, is to mark this day with a special communion service centered around prayers of remembrance. The marking of All Souls Day can be a helpful ritual for people in their ongoing journey of grief. You may like to put this in your diary now and you may like to place names of loved ones on the memorial list at the back of the church.

# Reflection

Job has taken God to task for his misfortunes and God's reply out of the whirlwind is an incredible reflection on divine authority. It is not the response that Job nor us are expecting. In a sense Job is reminded that he is not God and that he should recognize the divine authority of God.

Rabbi Harold Kushner in his excellent book: "When Bad Things Happen to Good People" reflects on it in a slightly different way. "I take these lines to mean 'if you think that it is so easy to keep the world straight and true, to keep unfair things from happening to people you try it.' God wants the righteous to live peaceful, happy lives, but sometimes even He can't bring that about. It is too difficult even for God to keep cruelty and chaos from claiming their innocent victims. But could man without God, do it better?"

Job is reminded that he is human and God is God, and to let God get on with the difficult task of managing the universe, whilst Job's task is to be faithful. Ultimately Job will receive God's blessing for his faithfulness.

James and John also long for divine privileges. They want to sit at the right and left hand of Jesus in the kingdom. They are slow learners because Jesus has already told them to become like a child to enter the kingdom. They must learn the way of service. Like Job, they must learn that their role as faithful

disciples is not to try and be God, but to serve God.
