THEME: The Way of Inclusion

Reflection

Today we bring to a conclusion our series of Old Testament Readings from Job. Whilst we have had just snapshots from this large book perhaps you've taken the time to read through the whole book during the week and realize the great depth of reflection within it. Job is waylaid by his sufferings, literally. His trials place him on the wayside as others carry on with their lives, and his so-called friends blame him for what has happened and tell him to repent. Today in the conclusion we find Job raised up from the wayside and his life finds blessing again. His friends are condemned for their misplaced words, but saved through the intercession of Job. The rifts between Job, his friends and God are healed and the experience of exclusion is transformed to inclusion.

A similar theme comes through the amazing example of Blind Bartimaeus in the Gospel reading. Bartimaeus too has been waylaid by suffering. Indeed his life is to sit by the wayside, begging for help. When he hears Jesus is passing, he calls out but is told to keep quiet. Others want to keep him in this place of suffering. But Jesus hears him, calls him, gives him the simple dignity of being able to name his



own request, and then as he is healed. Jesus proclaims that it is Bartimaeus' faith that has made him well. We are told that Bartimaeus then followed Jesus. In this simple episode a life is transformed from exclusion to inclusion.
