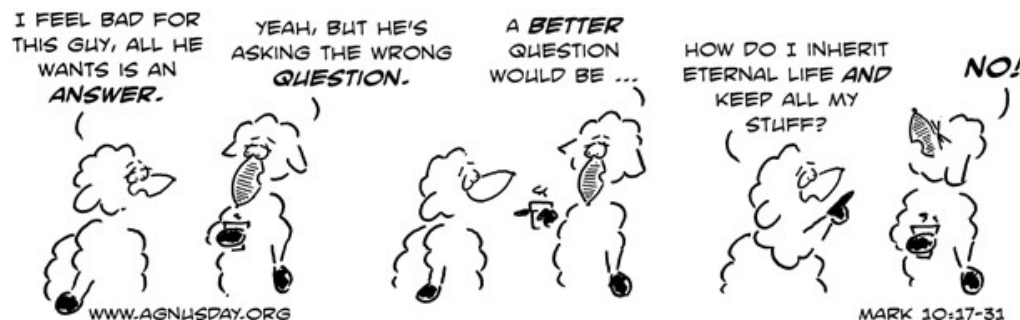
THEME: FINDING OUR WAY

Reflection

This week's scripture readings are about things that seem impossible. In one story, Jesus talks about something that is physically impossible—a camel going through the eye of a needle (Mark 10:25). Jesus also asks a man to do something that seems impossible to do—give up all his possessions and money (Mark 10:21).

In the Old Testament passages, the sufferings of Job and the Psalmist are such that they find it challenging to believe that God is still listening to their cries of despair.

Yet in all cases, God is ever-present, prompting people with new possibilities for finding their way. As the book of Hebrews affirms we have a Saviour who knows what it is like to be suffer and be tested, who can "sympathise with our weakness". God is not separate from us at such times - God is with us always, perhaps unrecognized like the risen Christ on the Road to Emmaus, but always with us helping us to find our way.
