THEME: Faithfulness

Reflection

I have always been struck by how similar the Magnificat (Mary's Song in Luke 1:46-55) is to the Song of Hannah (1 Samuel 2:1-10). Of course Mary would have known well the story of Hannah and Samuel, as would have Luke's community. In both cases these women are ordinary people like us, and yet they are chosen for an extraordinary task. In both cases their sons will go on to have a huge impact on the faithfulness of their people. But also interesting is the strong element of equalizing justice in these two songs of praise. The mighty, proud and powerful are brought low, and the weak and poor are raised up. The hungry are fed and those who had food will go hungry. The lowly are raised to places of honour. For these women, faithfulness means participating in God's justice in the knowledge that no matter how humble or lowly you may be, you can have a vitally important role in God's purposes.

The letter to the Hebrews points to the faithfulness of Jesus in opening for us a "new and living way" into God's sanctuary.

In the Gospel reading, faithfulness is about not being led astray from fidelity to Jesus even if there are difficulties and dangers ahead. Remain true to Jesus.
