# SECOND SUNDAY OF EPIPHANY 20TH JANUARY 2019 THEME: GOD'S NEW WAY IN THE WORLD

The Rev'd Julia mentioned last week, that the Gospel stories of the season of Epiphany describe various events that manifest the divinity of Jesus. It starts with the story of the Magi and the Baptism of Jesus. The Gospels for the other Sundays describe the wedding at Cana, the calling of the disciples, and various miracles and teachings of Jesus.

The stories call us to respond to Christ in faith through the showings of his divinity. However, at the wedding at Cana, Jesus responds to his Mother and resolves an unexpected problem in an unexpected way. Jesus was open to see and participate in new unexpected ways of God's work.

God is always willing to make things new. God is ready to work a miracle, (in whichever way He decides, not how we want it to be) God is willing to remake God's creation, and God can make the Spirit manifest in individual lives.



We simply need to be listening, watching and, waiting to see how God invites us to work with Him on the journey of our lives.
