
FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT 10th March 2019 THEME: SAVED BY GRACE

Reflection

This week, we remember the journey of the Israelites out of the Egyptian empire and into the desert for forty years. We also remember Jesus' journey into the wilderness for forty days where, at the start of his ministry, he faces temptations which remind us of the Roman empire. Rome's power was rooted in control of commerce (bread), demands for ultimate loyalty (worship) and peace through violence (security). Jesus rejects each of these temptations with a counterclaim that requires trust in the ways of God rather than the ways of empire.

Our forty day Lenten journey reflects these struggles too. As we live in the reality that we are Saved by Grace, we know that we are called to journey into deeper faith. How are our lives, individually and corporately, shaped by the values of today's empire which celebrates success, power and image, and how are our lives shaped by the inclusive, compassion-filled, justice-making ways of our creator God that Jesus exemplifies for us?
