Reflection

Today in the Gospel of St John, we hear the disciples proclaiming a risen Christ. They spoke of Christ with **BOLD CONFIDENCE**. They were greeted by Jesus with the same familiar words and actions, with a familiar purpose and message and received the Holy Spirit. Thomas had missed this event and doubted as some would. But he believed when he saw it with his own eyes.

God's loving ways cannot be contained and disrupt accepted norms, policies, and practices when they stand in opposition to that love. A disruptive love is the cornerstone of our faith. Such love also comes with risk and is sometimes 'beyond belief'.

In the midst of our own unfolding experiences of God, the church remains a community called to witness. In the repeated retelling of the story of resurrection, there is a time when fear moves over, and confidence begins. May this confidence take us into our communities to speak for justice and Love's agenda, Jesus agenda for all humanity.

***We are witnesses to your ways, O God.
May we be inspired to speak for justice
and love's agenda. When others would
silence the voice of liberation, may we shout
even louder. Amen.***
