Reflection

The Risen Christ brings transformation to people's lives. In today's readings we see monumental moments of transformation in two of the early church's most important leaders - Peter and Paul.

Peter, of course, was a dear friend and close disciple of Jesus, but also one who had denied knowing Jesus three times and then abandoned him at the crucifixion. Jesus' interaction with Peter by the sea of Tiberius allows Peter to move past his three denials with three affirmations of his love for Christ. This moment of forgiveness is transformative for Peter who goes on to be an incredibly strong and effective leader in the church.



Paul's transformation is so dramatic that having "a road to Damascus experience" has entered the English vernacular. Paul's transformation through his encounter with the Risen Christ is to turn completely about face from being an active persecutor of the church to being one of its most vocal proponents.

Each of our journeys has contained moments where we have been transformed by Christ. These might have been subtle up's and down's in the journey of faith, like Peter, or they might have been dramatic experiences like Paul. As we continue our celebration of Easter we give thanks that we have been transformed by the Risen Christ and we pray that others may know more fully his transforming love.

NEW ASSISTANT BISHOP

Archbishop Geoff Smith has announced, with the concurrence of the Diocesan Council, the appointment of the Venerable Denise Ferguson as an assistant bishop in the Diocese of Adelaide. Denise replaces Bishop Tim Harris who moved back to parish ministry late last year. Denise is at present the Rector of East Redland Anglican Parish and Archdeacon of Moreton in the Diocese of Brisbane. Denise is married to Mark and they have an adult daughter. Denise is originally from New Zealand where she ministered in the Diocese of Waikato and Taranaki and the Diocese of Wellington. Denise will be ordained a bishop in the church of God at St Peter's Cathedral on Sunday July 21 with the service beginning at 5pm.
