THEME: LOVE IS THE LAW

Our 7:45 and 8:45 services begin on p.119 of the green prayerbook


Reflection

There are many thoughts that can be brought together from the bible readings today but perhaps the most central is that everything comes under the law of God's love.

Peter's vision about which animals can be eaten seems at first look to be a little macabre, but in reality it is symbolic that the old divisions of clean/unclean have been swept away in Christ. The application of this is that the Gentile believers can receive baptism with water and the Holy Spirit just like the Jewish believers - all come under the law of love.

The Psalm brings together heaven and earth in a unity of praise, sweeping away any sense of there being an inseparable divide between God's realm and the human realm. This symbolism is taken further in the reading from Revelation which promises a new heaven and a new earth. All things will be made new so that there will be no more death, crying and pain, for they will be swept away by the power of God's love.

This theme is then summarized in the words of Jesus from John's Gospel, where, at the last supper, he gives his disciples a new commandment - to love one another as he has loved them - to love one another in servanthood with divine love, and through this love others will know that they are his disciples and others will come to know God's love. In this way, for Christians, love is the law.
