Reflection

I heard from a friend this week who is holidaying in Germany. She reported that Ascension Day (last Thursday) is a public holiday there and church services on the day are commonly held outside (no doubt in celebration of the warmer days). As well as that Father's day is linked to Ascension day. This confused her for a while until she reflected that the feast of Ascension celebrates Jesus return to his heavenly Father. In Germany this day is a time to celebrate with families and have special meals together.



In contrast, Ascension day seems almost forgotten in Australia. Indeed the church itself seems to pay it scant regard, and nowadays commonly refers to this Sunday as 'the Seventh Sunday of Easter' in preference to 'The Sunday after Ascension'. Perhaps we are embarrassed by an ancient concept of Jesus ascending to heaven 'up there'. When we know that upwards takes us into the stratosphere, the solar system and the outer reaches of the Galaxy.

However we should not give up too easily on a feast day and a church season (ascensiontide) that has spoke to Christians for centuries. Today we rethink this short season of the church's year in preparation for the celebration of Pentecost next Sunday.
