### Reflection

Fans of the dystopian TV drama, *The Handmaid's Tale*, will be familiar with the role of the "Martha's" in the fictional nation of Gilead. The Martha is the one usually seen in the kitchen and attending to household tasks. If you wondered where the name comes from, today's gospel reading (Luke 10:38-42) is the source.

Some parishioners might recall the old remark: *"Don't be such a Martha"* directed to someone who is fussing about things that don't matter. Today's reading seems to stir up great reactions in people. It seems unfair that Mary is praised for "doing nothing" while Martha, who does the useful work, gets put in her place.

Mary, we are told, sat at the Lord's feet. This was the traditional posture for the student of a Rabbi. Martha, however is distracted from her opportunity for learning. The purpose of the Gospel here is not to denigrate the important role of providing hospitality. Indeed in other places in the bible, the importance of that ministry is emphasized. Rather here, Martha has allowed herself to be distracted from the more important priority of this moment to be still in the presence of the Lord.

In our busy lives this is a reminder we do well to heed. What are the things that distract us from sitting quietly with the Lord. What excuses do we make? Who do we blame for our inability to slow ourselves down and make time to pray and listen to God?
