Reflection

Last week we considered that Mary sitting at the feet of Jesus [Luke 10:38-42], provided an example of the commandment to Love God, just as the parable of the Good Samaritan [Luke 10:25-37] provided an example of the commandment to love our neighbour.

The next section in Luke's Gospel continues the theme of Loving God through teaching us how to pray. In today's Gospel reading we encounter "The Lord's Prayer". You can find two versions of this in the New Testament [Luke 11:2-4 & Matthew 6:9-13]. They vary a little from each other, but both versions, along with a third from the Didache (an early church writing) inform the agreed ecumenical version we use in our prayerbook.

The Lord's prayer has been prayed continually, in a myriad of languages, for two thousand years. Whenever we pray it, we can guarantee that other Christians elsewhere in the world are praying it at the same time with us. It truly is a wonderful teaching from Jesus on "how to pray". It focusses our thoughts on loving God by the hallowing of his name, praying for God's kingdom to come and that God's will is done. It also gives voice to our own deep needs for sustenance,

forgiveness and protection.

Never be put off by how well-worn the words are. They have stood the test of time and can always speak to us in new ways and take us into deeper and deeper faith.
