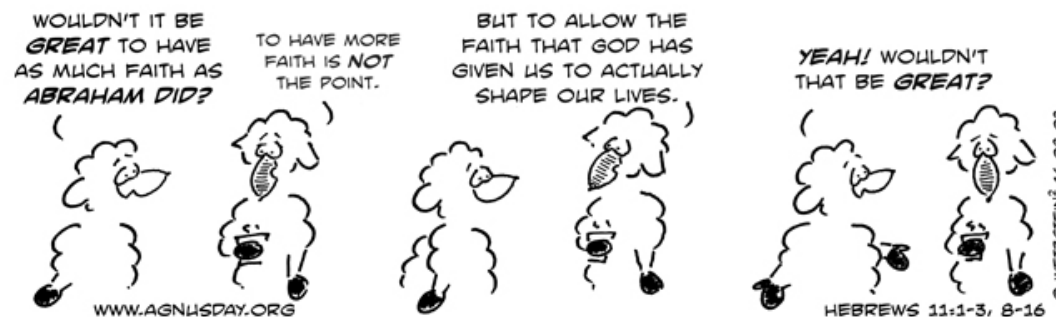

REFLECTION

Hebrews Chapter 11 offers us one of the timeless definitions of faith - "**Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen**" (v.1). The whole of this chapter holds up our forebears in the faith as great examples for us. In particular Abraham and Sarah are singled out for us to reflect on. They still had doubts, that is clear from Genesis, yet they trusted God to fulfil promises for them, even though they would not live to see the full fruition of God's providing. The writer of Hebrews encourages us to respond in faith to God's promises and calling on our lives, just as Sarah and Abraham did. Faith in things unseen is an active way of living now, not simply a passive waiting.

*God of eternal promises, you have been with your people in all times and places.
You have called us, and we have responded. Open us to your life-giving grace.
Empower us with the faith that supports us when we feel unsure,
that dares to challenge things that need to change,
and that always reminds us you are never, ever far away. Amen.*
