Reflection

The letter to Timothy invites us to prayerful living. We are urged to pray for everyone, including political leaders, so that all people may live in God's reign of peace and wholeness – shalom. God's wise ways lead and encourage us as we seek to live prayerfully as members of the Body of Christ and also as citizens of our own countries.

Pray as though everything depends on God. And work as if everything depends on VOU.

The Old testament reading from Jeremiah reminds us that it is okay to be totally honest in our praying. This prayer is in the form of a lament. Laments often involve questioning God and asking why certain situations persist. There is plenty of scope for us to lament about things, but alongside that we need prayers that affirm our faith (like Psam 27) "The Lord is my light and my salvation: whom shall I fear?". Through these readings we start to build up a picture of prayer being the means to express our feelings to God, affirm our faith in God, offer thanksgiving and pray for ourselves and others.

At first glance the parable of the dishonest manager seems not to add much to our theme of prayerful living. However if we look again this funny story has a trick ending. The manager reduces the customers' bills (probably reducing his own profit) in order to pave the way for his future in the community, but in the process he elevates his master's reputation and earns his master's praise. As we laugh at the humour of this, perhaps we can reflect that prayerful living means serving the needs of others above our own and in the process elevating the status of God.
