### Reflection

The theme "A New Identity" captures really well the essence of our bible readings today. For the prophet **Jeremiah** the simple image of the potter re-shaping a spoilt pot is a beautiful image of how God can reshape our lives despite the setbacks and shortcomings we have. **Psalm 139** paints a beautiful picture of how intimately God knows and loves us. The words from the psalm "you knit me together in my mother's womb" are especially poignant today as we celebrate baby Elijah's baptism in our 10am service. The verses from **Philemon** point to the transforming power of finding our identity in Christ. Paul pleads with Philemon to receive back his runaway slave, Onesimus, "no longer as a slave but more than a slave—a beloved brother". This demonstrates the radical equality that Christianity offered, and still offers, people in a world riven by divisions and prejudice. The new identity is one of being equal brothers and sisters in Christ.

The Gospel reading from **Luke** then takes this to a confronting level. Many people fixate on the word "hate" in this reading. What does Jesus mean? Is it simply hyperbole for shock value to get our attention? Whilst the message of Paul in his letter to Philemon is one of freedom and equality, Jesus shows there is a costly edge to this. Jesus points to the reality that this new identity may at times bring us into conflict with those closest to us. This is the struggle of taking up the cross. His parables encourage us to persist in seeing our faith through to the end, even if it means sacrifice.
