Reflection - Fullness in God

Psalm 145 is an acrostic poem with each verse beginning with consecutive letters in the Hebrew Alphabet. The impact of this is lost in the English translation but in the original language, using every letter of the alphabet emphasized the praise of God being woven through all of life and all of creation. We are only using some of the verses today - The first five verses focus mainly on what people do. The last five verses concentrate mainly on what God does. Verse two connects the here and now of the present with the fullness of all time. Verse three holds out the reminder that God is bigger than even the fullness of all time. Verse four proclaims how God's praise is passed on from one generation to the next, and the fullness of this treasure is then affirmed in verse 5, in a commitment by the psalmist to continue telling of God's glory and the story of God's marvellous works.

Living God of restoration and power, we want to be so occupied with your love for the world that we no longer fear the future. Your abiding spirit in our midst chases out fear. Guide us in the work of worship, so we find our fullness in you alone. Amen.

Saint Martin's Day - 11th November

Today we also celebrate the patronal festival of our church of St Martin's in Glenelg South. St Martin is perhaps best known for the converting incident in his life where after giving half his cloak to a beggar he later had a dream that the beggar was Christ. Martin became a monastic priest and is known as the father of European Monasticism. Such was his holiness that the people of Tours took him by force to be their bishop. He is venerated all over Europe with many different and interesting traditions.
