
GLENELG CHRISTMAS PAGEANT

Reflection

Last week in our Gospel reading we heard about the rich voung ruler who couldn't follow Jesus because he was too attached to his wealth. Today we hear about Zacchaeus who, though very wealthy and a despised tax collector for the Romans, willingly gave up half his possessions in response to Jesus' call to come and visit him.

Jesus routinely changed the perspectives of those who came into contact with him. When he asked to visit Zacchaeus, the perspective of the crowd was challenged as they grumbled that Jesus was going to associate with a "sinner". Zacchaeus' perspective was changed through being included by Jesus and it resulted in him generously giving away his wealth to those in need and to any he had defrauded.

It is a challenging thought to look at people the way Jesus might see them. Particularly if we don't like them, have been hurt by them, or have them pigeon-holed into a certain category. Can we allow Jesus to change our perspective about those we have judged harshly? Are there ways we need to change when we come into Jesus company?
