Today we read of Jesus' baptism and entry into public ministry. John's ministry was to prepare the way for the Messiah. His message was simple and straight forward: "Repent, because the kingdom of heaven has come near!" (Matthew 3:2). When people repented, he baptized them. The Jewish people were looking for a deliverer from the Roman oppressors. But it was more than that. The people's relationship with God had grown cold.

Jesus came from Galilee, (Mark 1:9) in great obscurity, in humility and obedience to God, to Jordan, to John, his servant, to be baptised by him. It's reasonable to inquire why Jesus desired to be baptized; it could not be to take away original or actual sin, since he had neither. It was to show his approval of John's baptism, and to bear a testimony of it, that it was from heaven; and also that he himself might receive a testimony both from heaven, and from John, that he was the Son of God and true Messiah.

Jesus was initiated and installed through the manifestation of the three persons in the sacred trinity. The Father confirming that His beloved Son was to be Mediator, the Son solemnly, entering upon the work; and the Holy Spirit, descending on him. The event set an example to followers of Jesus, and showed his readiness to comply with all God's righteous precepts.
