We all love to receive invitations to events such as birthdays, anniversaries, new premises or new homes or see new exhibits. In today's readings we see the Prophet Isaiah who knew his purpose was for the Lord before he was even born. He would invite and share with others who God is, what is required of God's people and the wonders of being God's people. Our Psalm also shows the wonders of the Lord, when we wait upon the Lord no matter the situation of our lives, of our world.

An invitation asks us to come and see something, but then learn of the wonders of the event. In the Gospel reading we read of John the Baptist recognising Jesus as the Lamb of God. Then, Andrew and Simon recognise Jesus is the Messiah too.

The readings invite us to Come and See who God is. How God knows us, cares for us and is ever present with us. But also invites us to share with others who God is too. How were you first invited to meet God? How different would that invitation be today?

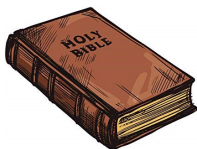
A prayer for the week
