Our readings stir up the possibility for the future that only hope can bring. Hope in Isaiah 60:1-6 is for a people who return to their land after being forcibly exiled and return to find everything in ruins. Hope in Psalm 72 is for people who have been oppressed. They're hope is for justice, liberation and care. St Paul writes in the letter to Ephesians 3:1-12 that hope comes in the mystery of faith, a revelation of who Christ is in our fruitful relationship with and in Him. We are all equal in Christ. In Matthew 2:1-12 the birth of Emmanuel (God is with us) gave hope that a King would be radically different to the tyrant and oppressive King Herod.

In our modern day Australia, we always have hope even where fire traps, destroys, kills. We hope see it in the eyes of fire fighters, the survivors, in products and labour donated to help all involved. A hope for a new day, for new opportunities, for a new perspective. Desmond Tutu said - "Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness."
