

Reflection



As we commence our Lenten pilgrimage towards Easter, invariably the question one gets asked, at least in Church circles, is: "So what are you giving up for Lent?". The likely responses include chocolate, cakes, coffee, soft drinks, sugar and so on. All good disciplines if they remind us of the season and enable us to give a bit more to charity. I came across a Lenten reflection that gave me pause for thought, suggesting there are other things we can fast from, and feast upon, during Lent. Just as Jesus made strong choices during his temptations perhaps this reflection will help us do the same.
