Reflection

Between the beginnings and endings of each day, we're given the opportunity to make clear choices in our lives. Every day we can grow in our faith as we face these choices.

The reading from Sirach 15:15–20 presents this theme of faithfulness and the freedom we have to choose whether or not to follow God's commandments.

Psalm 119:1–8 proclaims "happy are those" who wholeheartedly choose live God's way. This is always a journey of making the daily choice to live this way and grow in faith.

Working together is the message presented by Paul to the church at Corinth in 1 Corinthians 3:1–9. Regardless of who plants and waters the seeds, God gives the growth. Paul stresses that it is God and the growth that matter the most and that we are joined in a common purpose to achieve that growth.

Matthew 5:21–24 is part of a larger section in the sermon on the mount, that addresses questions of ethical behaviour. Today's Gospel places importance on the need for resolving anger and being reconciled to each other.
