Reflection

This week is the culmination of the Season after Epiphany; today we are sent to shine the light of Christ in the world. Today's readings show a God who is able to transform people through "mountain-top" experiences. Moses, Peter, James and John are all changed by an encounter with the God of light. The transfiguration of Jesus tells us that through the chaos of life, God is elevated over it all – in the hills, in the clouds, and over mountains.

Throughout this Season after Epiphany, we have heard about the light of God's love being revealed in new ways. On this Transfiguration Sunday, the light shines brightly but the moment passes quickly, and we recognize that we do not make our home on the mountains, rather we are sent down to continue the journey with Christ and to do the work of God. Consider what "mountain-top" experiences have affected you.
