

## Reflection

Today's Gospel reading, Matthew 5:13–20, continues the collection of Jesus' teachings known as the Sermon on the Mount—perhaps the greatest sermon ever preached!

In this week's reading, Jesus uses images of salt and light as he describes what it means to live according to the ways of God's realm. Jesus teaches his followers that they are salt –



cleansing, preserving, adding flavour; and they are light – revealing what is hidden and enabling all to see. Through these images, Jesus teaches that we participate in the kingdom of God when we live God's ways. Our light should shine before others, not so that they can applaud our piety, but so that our works can direct others to give thanks and praise to God. God, through us, gives light to everyone, to "all in the house." The word translated here as house is the word for "the established world" – it is a big house!
