### **Parish Priest's Message**

Dear Friends,

As we arrive at the Day of Pentecost and celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the first followers of Jesus, we recall that there would have been no birth of the church without Pentecost and no Pentecost without the resurrection and there would have been no resurrection without the birth of Christ. Incarnation, Resurrection, Inspiration. The three most important moments in the Christian story.



We have already referred a few weeks ago to the difference between John's Gospel and Luke/Acts in terms of the coming of the Holy Spirit. For John the

breathing of the Holy Spirit into the disciples is part of their experience of resurrection. For Luke it happens at Pentecost fifty days after the resurrection. Maybe both are true. In the end what matters is that somehow this group of scattered fearful followers of Jesus became an inspired, empowered, courageous and united group whose message of hope and salvation continues to transform our world to this day.

Pentecost is not about speaking in different languages and seeing flames dancing around. Pentecost is about the power of the Spirit to unite and inspire. In a way the church has gone through a Pentecost this year. Faced with restrictions that have prevented our main mode of being together as Christian community, we have been inspired to try new ways, new things, new modes of being, new paths of discipleship. Most importantly and most evidently our community has been infused with a sense of hope and encouragement. The Spirit is definitely at work in our church, the life of Pentecost continues, and our prayer continues to be veni sancte spiritus – come Holy Spirit.

#### Acts 2:1-8, 13-18


### A reading from the book of Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language?... But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

> "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,



and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions,
and your old men shall dream dreams.
Even upon my slaves, both men and women,
in those days I will pour out my Spirit;
and they shall prophesy.

### 1 Corinthians 12:1-13 A reading from St Paul's first letter to the Corinthians

No one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of

healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Make fertile our deserts within,


Break us and heal us,
