

Parish Priest's Message

Dear Friends,

I believe some people did not get their emailed pew sheet last week. We are still trying to work out the glitch and how many were affected. Just to re-iterate – Three of our worship services have recommenced.



7:45am St Peter's – recommenced Sunday 21st June 8:45am St Martin's – recommenced Sunday 21st June Thursday Service at St Peter's recommenced Thursday 25th June

For this Sunday 28th June we are still bound by the 1 person per 4sqm restriction – which mostly affects St Martin's (20 max in the church, 10 in the side annex). Please sign in to all services when you arrive. Sanitise your hands and observe social distancing. Prayerbooks and hymnbooks can be used and will be quarantined for a week following use.

Morning teas can resume this week following services provided that tea and coffee is made for people by a designated person(s) (no self-service) and there are no shared plates of food. We are trying to source individually wrapped biscuits for this.

10am St Peter's will re-commence Sunday 5th July.

From 29th June there is no maximum limit to attendance providing the building limit of 1 person per <u>2sqm</u>, and social distancing is observed. This will give us more flexibility in terms of attendance. Attendance records still need to be kept.

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

First Reading Genesis 22:1-14

A reading from the book of Genesis

God tested Abraham. He said to him, 'Abraham!' And he said, 'Here I am.' God said, 'Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt-offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you.' So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt-offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him.

On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. Then Abraham said to his young men, 'Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you.' Abraham took the wood of the burnt-offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together.

Isaac said to his father Abraham, 'Father!' And Abraham said, 'Here I am, my son.' Isaac said, 'The fire and the wood are here, but where is the lamb for a burnt-offering?' Abraham said, 'God himself will provide the lamb for a burnt-offering, my son.' So the two of them walked on together.

When they came to the place that God had shown him, Abraham built an altar there and laid the wood in order. He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven, and said, 'Abraham, Abraham!' And he said, 'Here I am.'

The angel said, 'Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me.' And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt-offering instead of his son. So Abraham called that place 'The Lord will provide'; as it is said to this day, 'On the mount of the Lord it shall be provided.'

- 2 How long must I suffer anguish in my soul, and be so grieved in my heart day and night: how long shall my enemy triumph over me?

- 4 Lest my enemy say 'I have prevailed': lest my foes exult at my overthrow.

Second Reading

Romans 6:13b-23

A reading from the book of Romans

Present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace.

What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. I am

speaking in human terms because of your natural limitations. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification.

When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

OBSERVING COVID safe REQUIREMENTS

It's wonderful to be back worshipping together. There are still some restrictions we need to observe:

For Church Attendance - register attendance, sanitise your hands as you enter and when you receive communion. Observe social distancing. No hand-shaking or hugs in the greeting of peace. The collection plate will not be passed. Communion will be by bread only.

For Morning Teas – designated person(s) to serve tea and coffee, including adding milk and sugar (no self-service or shared utensils). No shared plates of food, but a designated person can serve individual serves to each person. People are required to be seated for morning tea, no standing and mingling. Table groups they are to be separated by 1.5m as per cafes.

Finally after three months all our congregations will be back worshipping together. We will have the theme of Celebrating St Peter across our three services.
