Parish Priest's Message

Dear Friends,

The story of Joseph the dreamer from Genesis reads like a Hollywood blockbusters and indeed Andrew Lloyd-Webber's "Joseph and his Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat" continues to be an extremely popular musical for professionals and amateurs alike. You can brush up on the Joseph story by reading Genesis chapters 37 – 50. This Sunday and next Sunday have a couple passages from the story.

Joseph was a dreamer. His dreams about his brothers bowing down to him lead to his being sold into slavery in Egypt. His ability to interpret Pharoah's dreams enable him to save not only the Egyptians but also his only family with whom he is eventually reconciled. Joseph the dreamer, who is ridiculed and hated by his brothers for his uselessness, becomes their salvation. These twelve brothers become the twelve tribes of Israel and so there at the founding of a nation salvation comes through a dreamer.

In our new testament reading Paul's dream is for the salvation of all. And in the Gospel reading the dream-like encounter with Jesus on the water inspires us to dream that Christ lifts us above all the storms that assail us.

Our world needs dreamers - those who can imagine the world in new and creative ways; those who can imagine solutions to unsolveable problems; those who, through their dreams, can hear the whispers of God to live in faithful ways. Today as we hear of Joseph's big dreams we pray that God will give us good dreams for our world and that we may live always in the



wonderful dream that Jesus gives us in the vision of God's Kingdom.

First Reading Genesis 37.3-8, 12-14, 18-28 A reading from the book of Genesis

Now Israel loved Joseph more than any other of his children, because he was the son of his old age; and he had made him a long colourful robe with sleeves. But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him, and could not speak peaceably to him.

Once Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers, they hated him even more. He said to them, 'Listen to this dream that I dreamed. There we were, binding sheaves in the field. Suddenly my sheaf rose and stood upright; then your sheaves gathered around it, and bowed down to my sheaf.' His brothers said to him, 'Are you indeed to reign over us? Are you indeed to have dominion over us?' So they hated him even more because of his dreams and his words.

Now his brothers went to pasture their father's flock near Shechem. And Israel said to Joseph, 'Are not your brothers pasturing the flock at Shechem? Come, I will send you to them.'

Joseph's brothers saw him from a distance, and before he came near to them, they conspired to kill him. They said to one another, 'Here comes this dreamer. Come now, let us kill him and throw him into one of the pits; then we shall say that a wild animal has devoured him, and we shall see what will become of his dreams.' But when Reuben heard it, he delivered him out of their hands, saying, 'Let us not take his life.' Reuben said to them, 'Shed no blood; throw him into this pit here in the wilderness, but lay no hand on him'—that he

might rescue him out of their hand and restore him to his father. So when Joseph came to his brothers, they stripped him of his robe, the long robe with sleeves that he wore; and they took him and threw him into a pit. The pit was empty; there was no water in it.

Then they sat down to eat; and looking up they saw a caravan of Ishmaelites coming from Gilead, with their camels carrying gum, balm, and resin, on their way to carry it down to Egypt. Then Judah said to his brothers, 'What profit is there if we kill our brother and conceal his blood? Come, let us sell him to the Ishmaelites, and not lay our hands on him, for he is our brother, our own flesh.' And his brothers agreed. When some Midianite traders passed by, they drew Joseph up, lifting him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty pieces of silver. And they took Joseph to Egypt.

Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking towards them on the lake. But when the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.'

ORGAN ROOM SALT DAMP UPDATE

Initial internal works were carried out this week, removing loose plaster and applying a Westox Cocoon Poultice. This will draw out the moisture from the wall and then on 31st August the poultice will be removed and the wall will be re-rendered. Due to protective coverings over the organ to protect it from dust during this process, the organ will be out of action for the month of August and should be back in full voice on Sunday 13th September.



If you are feeling unwell or have flu-like symptoms – please stay home and use the online resources for private worship (pew sheet and Facebook)


