WORSHIP THEME: CUNNING, COMPASSION & COURAGE

Parish Priest's Message

Cunning, compassion and courage are all on display in today's Old Testament reading from Genesis. Moses' mother (Jochabed) and sister (Miriam) definitely show cunning and courage to protect Moses by hiding him in the reeds at the river bank. Pharaoh's daughter shows compassion in drawing Moses out of the reeds and courage in going against her father's edict. Miriam then shows cunning and courage in her offer to Pharaoh's daughter to fetch a wet nurse to feed Moses and then brings Moses' mother to do the job. Its suspenseful reading - can Moses escape this dangerous situation? It's only thanks to the cunning, compassion and courage of these three women that his safety is secured and he survives to grow up and become the great leader that his people are going to need.



Today's theme also reminds us of two other verses. In Matthew 10:16 when Jesus sends out his disciples he says: *"I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves."* Also in Luke 16:8 at the end of the parable of the dishonest manager: *"The master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly. For the people of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own kind than are the people of the light."* This theme gets us to think about how to use all our abilities (even our cunning) in the service of the kingdom. St Paul points out how important it is to use all the gifts of the community to help the whole body of Christ. So with that thought may we bring all the cunning, courage and compassion we possess to the fore as we seek to be God's community in this place and in these challenging times in which we live. *Fr Andrew*

First Reading

Exodus 1:8-12, 22 2:1-10

A reading from the book of Exodus

A new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. He said to his people, 'Look, the Israelite people are more numerous and more powerful than we. Come, let us deal shrewdly with them, or they will increase and, in the event of war, join our enemies and fight against us and escape from the land.' Therefore they set taskmasters over them to oppress them with forced labour. They built supply cities, Pithom and Rameses, for Pharaoh. But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread, so that the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites.

Then Pharaoh commanded all his people, 'Every boy that is born to the Hebrews you shall throw into the Nile, but you shall let every girl live.'

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him for three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him.



The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. 'This must be one of the Hebrews' children,'

she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, 'Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?' Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Yes.' So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, 'Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages.' So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, 'because', she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'

COVID MARSHALS

As of Friday 21st August we are required to have a COVID Marshal on duty for all public ceremonies. The COVID Marshals have to complete the online training (takes about 30minutes) and have the role to promote and ensure infection control practices; promote and encourage physical distancing requirements; ensure our COVID safe plan is in place; ensure the environment has sufficient seating, hand cleaning /sanitising facilities and cleaning regimes. The marshals help our COVID safe compliance but final responsibility still remains with priest and council.

All parish clergy have undertaken the training but we also need a group of lay people to be on call to do this. It could be done by one of the welcomers so long as they are not required to help with checking people in. Being able to comply with this requirement is necessary for us keeping our church services open, so if you are prepared to help (whether you are a rostered welcomer or not) then please speak to Andrew. The COVID marshal for each service will be identified at the start of each service.



Parish Council spent some time this week working through COVID Safe requirements and current advice specifically with regards to singing. At this stage we do not want to stop singing as we believe it serves a very important spiritual function in our worship and provides great comfort and inspiration which we need at this time. However it is important that we physically distance as much as possible to enable singing to be safe. We will consider limiting some of the singing we do and also limit movement during singing which could be seen as higher risk. Further advice is forthcoming.
