Parish Priest's Message

Dear Friends,

I'm sure all of us can remember childhood experiences of being lost. Perhaps it was in a supermarket or department store or at the playground. As panic rose within us we rapidly looked around for some familiar face or landmark to get our bearings. It seems like nothing captivates the news cycle like an emergency hunt for a lost child. Then there is an outpouring of communal relief when rescuers find the lost one (even if we don't personally know the people involved). I wonder if that is because we personally relate very deeply to the panic of being lost and the relief of being found.

Our Gospel reading today is the parable of the lost sheep and perhaps the two most famous hymns in Christian history deal with the imagery of being lost and found and being shepherded.

Amazing Grace how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me, I once was lost but now am found....



Yea, though I walk in death's dark vale, yet will I fear no ill: For thou art with me; and thy rod and staff me comfort still.

Today we consider the theme - Finding the Lost. We reflect on the passion of God for the lost ones of this world and so are asked to share in that call to reach out to the lost. We also reflect on our own lostness and our continual need to be found by God and to be shepherded into green pastures.

Many in our society feel lost at the moment. So much of the security of our lives, which we took for granted, now seems to be on shaky ground. Yet there is so much in our Christian story to reassure us that God can find us and shepherd us through these difficult times.

Jesus, good shepherd of the sheep, by whom the lost are sought and guided into the fold: feed us and we shall be satisfied, heal us and we shall be whole, and lead us that we may be with you, where you live and reign in communion with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

First Reading Exodus 12:1-14

A reading from the book of Exodus

The LORD said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbour in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. Your lamb shall be without blemish, a year-old male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats. You shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month; then the whole assembled congregation of Israel shall slaughter it at twilight. They shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. They shall eat the lamb that same night; they shall eat it roasted over the fire with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted over the fire, with its head, legs, and inner organs. You shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the LORD. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgements: I am the LORD. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.


This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the LORD; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

Love does no wrong to a neighbour; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armour of light.

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus spoke to his disciples:



'Take care that you do not despise one of these little ones; for, I tell you, in heaven their angels continually see the face of my Father in heaven. What do you think? If a shepherd has a hundred sheep, and one of them has gone astray, does he not leave the ninety-nine on the mountains and go in search of the one that went astray? And if he finds it, truly I tell you, he rejoices over it more than over the ninety-nine that never went astray. So it is not the will of your Father in heaven that one of these little ones should be lost.

'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.'

CALLING ALL SINGERS AND MUSICIANS - MESSAGE FROM ANDREW

We are deeply saddened at the news that congregational singing in Anglican public worship has to cease due to COVID restrictions. I know that this will greatly affect us as singing is a hugely unifying and inspirational aspect of our worship. Yet with every barrier that we face there are new opportunities. Soloists and small



singing groups are allowed if spaced out "particularly from the attending public." This presents a chance to involve more people in our music.

So I would be very keen to hear from anyone who is prepared to share their instrumental or vocal talents with the congregation. You may like to sing a favourite hymn either solo or with a couple others as a quiet reflection. You may be prepared to play your instrument during communion. You may be prepared to come to a session at church to record some hymns for our Facebook posts.
