## Parish Priest's Message

The parable of the workers in the vineyard is one of my favourites of Jesus' parables but it is also deeply unsettling. Whenever I have shared this parable with school children their immediate response is: "That's not fair!" We might find it deeply challenging that all the workers get paid the same amount (which is a generous day's pay) regardless of how long they have worked. My follow up question to the children usually goes along these lines: "Do you do jobs at home for your parents?" (most say yes) "who has younger brothers and sisters?" (some say yes to this). "Are those younger siblings able to do the same jobs as you do?" Usually they answer that they do much more than their younger siblings. Then I ask: "Do your parents love you the same, even though you don't all do the same amount of work as each other?" They usually admit that their parents love them equally no matter what.

Jesus is trying to instil an attitude of generosity in his followers that is akin to the generosity of God. God loves us all generously, indiscriminately and equally. The workers come to the vineyard at different times and do different amounts of work but God's love is a constant. What matters is that they are in the vineyard.

A Priest I used to work with enjoyed the saying: "Jesus came to comfort the disturbed and disturb the comfortable!" How might this parable comfort or disturb us? How might it help us to see others with God's eyes?

## First Reading Exodus 16:2-15 A reading from the book of Exodus

The whole congregation of the Israelites complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. The Israelites said to them, 'If only we had died by the hand of the Lord in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the fleshpots and ate our fill of bread; for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger.'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'I am going to rain bread from heaven for you, and each day the people shall go out and gather enough for that day. In that way I will test them, whether they will follow my instruction or not. On the sixth day, when they prepare what they bring in, it will be twice as much as they gather on other days.' So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord, because he has heard your complaining against the Lord. For what are we, that you complain against us?' And Moses said, 'When the Lord gives you meat to eat in the evening and your fill of bread in the morning, because the Lord has heard the complaining that you utter against him—what are we? Your complaining is not against us but against the Lord.'

Then Moses said to Aaron, 'Say to the whole congregation of the Israelites, "Draw near to the Lord, for he has heard your complaining." 'And as Aaron spoke to the whole congregation of the Israelites, they looked towards the wilderness, and the glory of the Lord appeared in the cloud. The Lord spoke to Moses and said, 'I have heard the complaining of the Israelites; say to them,

"At twilight you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have your fill of bread; then you shall know that I am the Lord your God." '

In the evening quails came up and covered the camp; and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. When the layer of dew lifted, there on the surface of the wilderness was a fine flaky substance, as fine as frost on the ground. When the Israelites saw it, they said to one another, 'What is it?' For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, 'It is the bread that the Lord has given you to eat.

Hear the word of the Lord.

Gospel Matthew 20.1-16

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus said to his disciples: 'the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire labourers for his vineyard. After agreeing with the labourers for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. When he went out about nine o'clock, he saw others standing idle in the market-place; and he said to them, "You also go into the vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." So they went. When he went out again about noon and about three o'clock, he did the same. And about five o'clock he went out and found others standing around; and he said to them, "Why are you standing here idle all day?" They said to him, "Because no one has hired us." He said to them, "You also go into the vineyard." When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his manager, "Call the labourers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and then going to the first." When those hired about five o'clock came, each of them received the usual daily wage. Now when the first came, they thought they would receive more; but each of them also received the usual daily wage. And when they received it, they grumbled against the landowner, saying, "These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat." But he replied to one of them, "Friend, I am doing you no wrong; did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what belongs to you and go; I choose to give to this last the same as I give to you. Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or are you envious because I am generous?" So the last will be first, and the first will be last.'


