WORSHIP THEME: PROPHETIC VISION

Parish Priest's Message

"I have seen the promised land, I may not get there with you, but I want you to know, that we as a people, will get to the promised land." Many will recognise those famous words of Martin Luther King Jr., made in a speech just before his assassination. King was resonating with the experience of Moses that we hear in today's Old Testament reading. Moses, who has led the people for forty years, is allowed to see the



promised land but he will die before he can enter it – his task is completed. Moses' successor, Joshua, is then named as the leader who will take the people forward.

We are only where we are at this moment because of the prophetic vision of those who have gone before us. None us were alive when our church was built. A community of people had a vision for a place of worship here and since that time the baton has been passed on from generation to generation. At times communities may lose vision, and even lose hope. Some churches close and new ones arise. Many people wonder about the place of the church in a society where church affiliation has been decreasing for decades, even though world-wide Christianity is increasing. What is our calling in this time and place in history? Where is the promised land we want the next generation to find and what resources do we need to hep them get there?

St Paul speaks of Courage to proclaim the Gospel in the face of opposition, whilst also ministering in a way that is as gentle as a breast-feeding mother. Jesus distils our calling down to the two great commandments - to Love God and love our neighbour as we love ourselves. The church must offer hope, vision, peace, empowerment, inspiration and, above all love, as we find new ways to navigate the wilderness of our times towards the promised land. Let us continually pray for faithfulness in that task.

You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: you shall love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

Prayer of the day

O God, whose Son has taught us that love is the fulfilment of your law: stir up within us the fire of your Holy Spirit, and pour into our hearts your greatest gift of love, so that we may love you with our whole being, and our neighbours as ourselves; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

First Reading Deuteronomy 34:1-12 A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho, and the Lord showed him the whole land: Gilead as far as Dan, all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the Western Sea, the Negeb, and the Plain—that is, the valley of Jericho, the city of palm trees—as far as Zoar. The Lord said to him, 'This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, "I will give it to your descendants"; I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not cross over there.'

Then Moses, the servant of the Lord, died there in the land of Moab, at the Lord's command. He was buried in a valley in the land of Moab, opposite Beth-peor, but no one knows his burial place to this day. Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died; his sight was unimpaired and his vigour had not abated. The Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of Moab for thirty days; then the period of mourning for Moses was ended.

Joshua son of Nun was full of the spirit of wisdom, because Moses had laid his hands on him; and the Israelites obeyed him, doing as the Lord had commanded Moses.

Never since has there arisen a prophet in Israel like Moses, whom the Lord knew face to face. He was unequalled for all the signs and wonders that the Lord sent him to perform in the land of Egypt, against Pharaoh and all his servants and his entire land, and for all the mighty deeds and all the terrifying displays of power that Moses performed in the sight of all Israel.

A reading from the first letter to the Thessalonians

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, but though we had already suffered and been shamefully maltreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure



motives or trickery, but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others, though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.


