

Parish Priest's Message

Do you have a favourite saint? What is it about them that inspires you? Or do you think saints seem too other-worldly, old fashioned and irrelevant? Today, November 1st, is All Saints Day or All Hallows Day. It is a day to give thanks for all of God's Saints, both the famous ones and the everyday ones. Saints are ordinary people who have shown extraordinary faith.

Today's obsession with Comic-book superheroes, sports stars and movie idols might point to the human need for heroes who are a modern day equivalent to how previous generations may have seen Saints. Yet as Christians we still need heroes of the faith and I would argue that the power (and entertainment value) of many saints' stories are just as good, or better, and more real than the latest Marvel movie on Netflix.

Of course, as well as the saints who are recognised by the church in our liturgical calendar, there are many other less famous people, living and departed, that we personally think of as saints. All Souls day will follow tomorrow (November 2nd) as a day to remember all those others who rest eternally in God's love. We will provide this week, as we do every year, a service on Wednesday 4th at 7:00pm as a chance to pause and remember all those whose lives have touched ours and who we still remember with great love for all they gave us in their lifetime. They are saints to us and we remember them often with love. Please use the memorial list in the church if you would like them remembered in our All Souls service and please consider coming along to this beautiful and reflective annual service.

A reading from the book of Revelation

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying,

'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!'

And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing,

'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE WAR MEMORIAL CHAPEL OF ST MICHAEL
