Parish Priest's Message

On Thursday I asked the students in school chapel if the word **Advent** reminded them of another word. A couple of guesses later a student replied:


"Adventure!" In actual fact the two words Advent and Adventure may not be philogically connected but we can certainly connect them theologically.



Both words connect to Old French words, 'advent' meaning arrival and 'aventure' meaning to chance something or to take a risk or a venture. Of course we generally think of Advent being a season to prepare for Christ's arrival, whilst also reflecting on the readings that assure us that Christ will arrive again one day. But there is also a sense of adventure about all of this as well. Certainly God takes a risk in the vulnerable birth of Christ. Mary and Joseph take many risks to protect Jesus, and the magi certainly venture a lot to go on their adventure to find the infant king.

Nearer to home, for us, we are being called on an *adventure* into a new liturgical year for the church. We wonder what the next twelve months will hold for us and our world. We wonder how the incarnation can speak to our world suffering under pandemic and economic strain.

There's a Michael Leunig prayer that seems especially appropriate this year. It reminds us of the power, truth and hope of the incarnation. Reminding us that *Advent* is always an *adventure*, and a risky one at that. But God is with us on this journey as we step into this season and into this new liturgical year with hope, peace, joy and love.

First Reading Isaiah 64:1-9

A reading from the book of Isaiah

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity.

we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

Do not be exceedingly angry, O Lord, and do not remember iniquity for ever.
