WORSHIP THEME: AWAKENING TO GOD'S CALL

#### Parish Priest's Message

It is a strange question to ask but how productive is your night's sleep? Your body is not only repairing itself, it's processing information from the previous day's activities too. Often a good night's sleep results in a sure foundation for a day ahead. We read in the Bible stories about awakening to God's call foreshadow the ways that God brings us through the unknown. This awakening is far better than those nightmares!

Psalm 139 reminds us how glorious and assuring it is to be known by God. It is also unsettling to know God understands us so deeply too. When we place boundaries around what God can do, or how we experience God's work in our lives, we discount His omniscience; we discount the power of God in our lives.

God does not create us to be disempowered from his strength, rather connected and cherished as his people. As His people, we all yearn to bask at His feet in glory. It can be difficult to understand the mysterious ways God works. We need to be assured His work in us hinges on us seeking God's truth, wisdom and will for ourselves and others.

Mighty God, your servants are listening. Help us to recognise your voice, your guidance in our lives. Help us to respond to your instructions and courage and honesty so that we may show love for you and your people. Amen.

## First Reading 1 Samuel 3.1-10

### A Reading from the First Book of Samuel

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to the Lord under Eli. The word of the Lord was rare in those days; visions were not widespread. At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Lord, where the ark of God was. Then the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' and he said, 'Here I am!' and ran to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' But he said, 'I did not call; lie down again.' So he went and lay down.

The Lord called again, 'Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' But he said, 'I did not call, my son; lie down again.' Now Samuel did not yet know the Lord, and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. The Lord called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, 'Here I am, for you called me.' Then Eli perceived that the Lord was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, 'Go, lie down; and if he calls you, you shall say, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." 'So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

Now the Lord came and stood there, calling as before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' And Samuel said, 'Speak, for your servant is listening.'

- 14 You knew my soul, and my bones were not hidden from you: when I was formed in secret,
- and woven in the depths of the earth.
- 15 Your eyes saw my limbs when they were yet imperfect: and in your book were all my members written;
- 16 Day by day they were fashioned: and not one was late in growing.
- 17 How deep are your thoughts to me, O God: and how great is the sum of them!
- 18 Were I to count them, they are more in number than the sand: were I to come to the end, I would still be with you.

## 2nd Reading 1 Corinthians 6.13-15, 17-20 A Reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians

The body is meant not for fornication but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ; anyone united to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Shun fornication! Every sin that a person commits is outside the body; but the fornicator sins against the body itself.



Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, which you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you were bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body.

#### Wellbeing for Over 50's – Chair Exercises


