Parish Priest's Message

Love of the light and fear of the darkness is deeply ingrained into the human psyche. We associate light with goodness and safety, yet here on the mount of transfiguration, the disciples witness God's light upon Jesus and the experience is so overwhelming, they are terrified. Despite their terror, Peter wants to stay in this moment "Its good to be here" he blurts out, wanting to set up some dwellings to stay in this moment of God's terrifying blazing light of goodness. But this vision of light is just a glimpse, a divine reassurance that God is with Jesus, and that a destination of glory awaits him. However



there is a path that must be walked first - the earthly path to the cross. The classic hymn **"How Good, Lord to be Here**" sums this up in the final verse of the hymn.

How good Lord to be here! Yet we may not remain; but since you bid us leave the mount come with us to the plain.

The Transfiguration teaches us an important spiritual lesson. Sometimes we cannot escape the challenges ahead of us, but what we need is a reassurance of God's presence to help us journey through whatever it is that we are facing. In such situations this can be our prayer:

Lord please travel this day with me. Reassure me of your presence and your love, So that, when I am daunted by challenges before me, your light may guide my path. Amen.

Happy Saint Valentine's Day to all the love-birds in our parish. We pray that your love may grow ever stronger in God's Love. We also pray for all those who are lonely or grieving on this day, that the Holy Spirit's comforting presence will assure you of God's love for you.

First Reading

2 Kings 2.1-12

A reading from the Second book of Kings

Now when the Lord was about to take Elijah up to heaven by a whirlwind, Elijah and Elisha were on their way from Gilgal. Elijah said to Elisha, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me as far as Bethel.' But Elisha said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So they went down to Bethel. The company of prophets who were in Bethel came out to Elisha, and said to him, 'Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?' And he said, 'Yes, I know; keep silent.'

Elijah said to him, 'Elisha, stay here; for the Lord has sent me to Jericho.' But he said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So they came to Jericho. The company of prophets who were at Jericho drew near to Elisha, and said to him, 'Do you know that today the Lord will take your master away from you?' And he answered, 'Yes, I know; be silent.'

Then Elijah said to him, 'Stay here; for the Lord has sent me to the Jordan.' But he said, 'As the Lord lives, and as you yourself live, I will not leave you.' So the two of them went on. Fifty men of the company of prophets also went, and stood at some distance from them, as they both were standing by the Jordan. Then Elijah took his mantle and rolled it up, and struck the water; the water was parted to the one side and to the other, until the two of them crossed on dry ground.



When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, 'Tell me what I may do for you, before I am taken from you.' Elisha said, 'Please let me inherit a double share of your spirit.' He responded, 'You have asked a hard thing; yet, if you see me as I am being taken from you, it will be granted you; if not, it will not.' As they continued walking and talking, a chariot of fire and horses of fire separated the two of them, and Elijah ascended in a whirlwind into heaven. Elisha kept watching and crying out, 'Father, father! The chariots of Israel and its horsemen!' But when he could no longer see him, he grasped his own clothes and tore them in two pieces.



Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified.



Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them any more, but only Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.
