

Parish Priest's Message

The Last time Easter fell on the 4th April was in 1999. It was the year that the Church of England decided to launch this controversial advertising campaign (right) to get people to come back to church for Easter and encounter the real Jesus. Using an archetypal revolutionary pose to depict Jesus stirred up a lot of debate as to whether it was an appropriate image. It certainly got people talking.

There are many Gospel passages that show the gentleness, compassion and servanthood of Jesus but in today's gospel reading we see a different side of Jesus – the activist, the dissenter, the angry zealot and, dare we say it, the revolutionary. Jesus' motivation for clearing the money changers from the temple was well-founded. He was shocked by their corruption and their oppression of the poor. His apparently violent actions might startle or surprise us if we are too wedded to





the image of "Gentle Jesus, Meek and Mild" as the advertising poster above attempts to challenge. Certainly the people of Jesus' day were shocked as many scholars suggest this episode was instrumental in causing the plot to kill Jesus. This episode has also inspired artists through the centuries who have appreciated an image of a more passionate and animated Jesus.

This Gospel passage gets us to reflect that faithful living sometimes means taking drastic action against oppression and injustice. Every Christian must wrestle with the implications of this for their own lives.

First Reading Exodus 20.1-17 A reading from the book of Exodus

Then God spoke all these words: I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and the fourth generation of those who reject me, but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. For six days you shall labour and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, your son or your daughter, your male or female slave, your livestock, or the alien resident in your towns. For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the sabbath day and consecrated it. Honour your father and your mother, so that your days may be long in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour. You shall not covet your neighbour's house; you shall not

covet your neighbour's wife, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or

anything that belongs to your neighbour.

 - the command of the Lord is true, and makes wise the simple.
- ⁸ The precepts of the Lord are right, and rejoice the heart:
 - the commandment of the Lord is pure, and gives light to the eyes.

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written,

'I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,

Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? The Passover of the Jews was near, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. In the temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and doves, and the moneychangers seated at their tables. Making a whip of cords, he drove all of them out of the temple, both the sheep and the cattle. He also poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned



their tables. He told those who were selling the doves, 'Take these things out of here! Stop making my Father's house a market-place!' His disciples remembered that it was written, 'Zeal for your house will consume me.'

The Jews then said to him, 'What sign can you show us for doing this?' Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews then said, 'This temple has been under construction for forty-six years, and will you raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the temple of his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this; and they believed the scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

FREE TECHNOLOGY CLASSES FOR THE OVER 50'S

The Corner Uniting Church is offering to host free digital literacy classes to those over 50: Learn how technology can connect you with family, friends & the wider community. Do you have a smartphone, tablet or computer but not sure how to use it or want to learn some handy hints & tricks to gain more confidence? If this sounds like you, then help is available through a series of free mini classes funded by the Be Connected Program to increase digital literacy in the over 50's. Classes are small with a maximum of 4-5 people in a group and hands on so bring your device along and discover that it is not as hard as you think. Handouts will be provided each week so you can practice what you learn including connecting to WiFi safely, viewing recorded church services online, and using Video Chat tools such as FaceTime, WhatsApp or Zoom to connect with loved ones.
