### Parish Priest's Message

The Fourth Sunday of Lent (variously known as Laetare Sunday, Refreshment Sunday and Mothering Sunday) marks the halfway point in Lent. It has traditionally been a day to especially lighten the Lenten disciplines and celebrate with posies of flowers, Simnel cakes and feasting.

Our Old Testament reading today reassures us of God's protection. The New Testament reading celebrates God's unconditional love as does the Gospel reading which, in this well-known text, assures us that God's



salvation is based on self-giving love. The psalm is one of the most beautiful celebrations of maternal imagery in the bible.

These are all great themes to have before us on Mothering Sunday as we pause to pray for our mothers and give thanks for the care of mother church. The church may not always live up to its lofty calling to be the universal mother to all people, but we constantly return again and again to the vision that we will grow deeper into the vocation of self-giving love that God models for us. We pray today for the church universal, in all its aspects, that church communities around the world may be places of welcome, inclusion, healing, sanctuary and salvation to any who seek it.

# First Reading Numbers 21.4-9 A reading from the Book of Numbers

The Israelites set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom; but the people became impatient on the way. The people spoke against God and against Moses, 'Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food.' Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. The people came to Moses and said, 'We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us.' So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.


