### Parish Priest's Message

Thank you to all those attending our Annual Combined Service and Vestry Meeting today. As your parish priest I only ever think of this as 'one'parish. I realise though many parishioners may tend to think of their church as just the congregation they worship in, or perhaps just the small group activity they



attend. I want to challenge everyone to see that we are one united Anglican Parish of Glenelg. Vestry Day offers a very real celebration of that fact and gives us the chance to worship together. Perhaps we may even meet some people who have been in the parish for years but, until now, we have never met. So if you are reading this in advance of Sunday morning, I encourage you to take the chance to come along and be part of it.

There is nothing controversial to discuss in the vestry meeting and all the positions have received enough nominations. We do have some news to share about our Heritage Conservation plans. I would also like to flag at vestry that Parish Council will be discussing recent communication to parishes from the Archbishop which will allow (for parishes that agree) provision of individual cups for communion. This means we could re-introduce the wine along with the bread for communion. There are some big practical issues to consider in managing this for a congregation the size of our Sunday 10am service. Smaller services will be more feasible. Is this a direction we wish to go in? It seems likely the common cup will not return in the near future and this could be a possible stop-gap solution. Of course, for many church denominations (usually ones that only have communion infrequently) individual cups are the only way they distribute communion. Whilst this is a Parish Council decision, I'd like to informally gauge the response of vestry.

In conclusion, thank you to each one of you for being part of our parish community. Thank you for your prayers and your worship. Thank you for your volunteering. Thank you for your shared pastoral care of one another. May God continue to guide us and help us grow into our Christian vocation here at Glenelg.


#### Gospel
