WORSHIP THEME: Entering Holy Week

Parish Priest's Message

Praise! Expectation! Anger! Jealousy!
Service! Sharing! Prayer! Betrayal! Denial!
Pain! Suffering! Sacrifice! Sadness! Grief!
Hope! Love! Life! This week has it all! For
the Christian, no other series of days in the
Christian year is as important or as
meaningful as Holy Week.

The themes of this week are too big to capture in a single service and so we commemorate and live them through a



series of services which form one continuous liturgical journey. Today we start that journey entering Jerusalem with Jesus. The crowd's expectant hysteria reaches fever pitch when they see a "new king humble and riding on a donkey" (Zechariah 9:9). We capture this moment through the symbol of the palm branches decorating the churches and a palm cross for you each to take home.

I recommend that after this service you read on from today's Gospel right through to the end of St Mark's Gospel reading. A helpful reading plan might be:

Monday vv.11:12 – 12:12; Tuesday 12:13 - 13:8; Wednesday 13:9 – 14:2;

Maundy Thursday 14:3 – 31; Good Friday 14:32 – 15:41;

Holy Saturday 15:42-47; Easter Day 16:1-8

As you read, allow your imagination to take you into the situations you are reading about, imagining that you are actually present. Notice your reactions and responses and pray about them. This meditative reading of the scriptures, as suggested by St Ignatius, can help us really engage with the divine drama and connect it with our own lives. Each of our Holy Week services will tie in with different parts of this Gospel drama – The last Supper (our Passover meals); the crucifixion (our Good Friday services); and the Resurrection (Easter Day).

May God bless each of you richly as we walk the journey of Holy Week together that our lives may be touched anew with God's gift of abundant resurrection life. *Fr Andrew*



And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross. Therefore God also highly exalted him


and gave him the name that is above every name,

Gospel Mark 11:1-11

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint John Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples and said to them, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." 'They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting,

'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!'

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.
