

Priest's Reflection – Rev Andrew

Today's readings continue the theme of Wisdom from last week. Chapter 31 of Proverbs celebrates the qualities of a loving wife. Verse 26 says: *She opens her mouth with wisdom, and the teaching of kindness is on her tongue*. Psalm 1 celebrates the wisdom of the person who delights in the law of the Lord and beautifully describes that person being like a flourishing tree planted by flowing water. The letter of James is sometimes called the wisdom letter of the New Testament. It certainly has strong wisdom themes throughout and today includes the beautiful quote pictured on this page. It encourages us to pray for God's wisdom and assures us in verse 18 that *a*



harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. Finally in our Gospel reading, Jesus, the child of wisdom, shares the wisdom of the messiah who must be a suffering servant for others. He also shows his disciples that those who want to enter the kingdom of God must become like a little child.

We pray for God's eternal wisdom to help us live in these challenging times. May we walk the path of wisdom, in peacefulness, gentleness, full of mercy, bearing good fruits and living without partiality and without hypocrisy.



FAREWELL BISHOP JOHN SPONG

Bishop John Spong died this week on 12th September at the age of 90. Bishop of Newark 1979-2000, he was a prolific writer particularly in the area of liberal reinterpretation of Christianity. He was the first Episcopal bishop to ordain women to the priesthood. He was often at the centre of controversy over his views but for many people his broad inclusive view helped them find a place within the church. For others they felt he stepped outside the bounds of orthodoxy. However people feel about him, he was someone who brought Christianity into public awareness and made us think reflectively on what we believe. We have two of his books in the parish library and he wrote many more.

CURRENT COVID RESTRICTIONS — UPDATED 9TH SEPTEMBER:

Please follow the current SA Health regulations

- 1. Please check-in by QR code or on the slips of paper when attending.

(ie parish group gatherings on our premises that are not open to the public do not require masks but do require social distancing.)
