Priest's Reflection - Rev Andrew

The man in today's Gospel reading asks a question of Jesus that many people might ask: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" The question assumes that if we "do" a certain amount of good stuff we will be saved. But Christianity is not about doing enough things to get into heaven. Rather it is about allowing God into the context of our lives and letting God's grace transform



us here and now. Sometimes this is difficult for us. The reading from Job and the psalm put before us the very human experience of searching for God but not finding, or questioning God and feeling abandoned. The letter to the Hebrews puts this in context. God understands how we feel — "we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are." Jesus challenges the disciples today with what seems like an impossible means of entering God's kingdom, but then reassures them that it is not really impossible because it is God who makes it possible rather than us.

God has made my heart faint;


the Almighty has terrified me;

For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?'

Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother." '



He said to him, 'Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.' Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, 'How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!' And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' They were greatly astounded and said to one another, 'Then who can be saved?' Jesus looked at them and said, 'For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.'

Peter began to say to him, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you.' CURRENT COVID RESTRICTIONS — UPDATED 23RD SEPTEMBER:

Please follow the current SA Health regulations

- 1. Please check-in by QR code or on the slips of paper when attending.
- 2. Masks must be worn indoors for public events and public areas. This applies to worship. However those doing bible readings, intercessions and preaching may remove them when presenting. (ie parish group gatherings on our premises that are not open to the public do not require masks but do require social distancing.)
- 3. Singing can take place but masks must be worn.

- 5. Masks may be removed for receiving communion. Please sanitise your hands prior to receiving and observe social distancing when queuing.

Artificial Christmas Trees really started becoming popular in the early 20^{th} century. The first artificial tree was created in Germany and was made out of dyed goose feathers. In the Edwardian period, Christmas Trees made from coloured ostrich feathers were popular at "fashionable" parties. Around 1900 there was even a short fashion for white trees — so if you thought coloured trees are a new invention, they're not! Over the years artificial trees have been made from feathers, papier mâché, metal, glass and many different types of plastic.
