Advent Lighting Liturgy - Rev Andrew

Advent is a season of waiting: waiting for the **hope**, **peace**, **joy**, and **love** of God to break into our lives anew through the story of the birth of Jesus, and through our shared acts of hope, peace, joy, and love. It is also a season of waiting for the ultimate revelation of Christ in the fullness of time.

During Advent we have our much loved practice of lighting candles on the Advent wreath; The green of the wreath represents the evergreen life of Christ. The circle of the wreath represents the never-ending eternity of God's love. Each candle is a stage on our journey of preparing our hearts to receive Christ anew this Christmas.

Today as we light the first candle, the candle of **hope**, we sing...

Prepare the way, prepare the way, A flame is burning bright. For Jesus Christ is coming The Way, the Truth, the Life



As we light the candle of hope,

we remember the stories of God with us in the past, when life has been hard, and not what we expected.

We trust that God is with us now, as we wait for hope to be born anew in us.

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you Jesus Christ

Jesus said to his disciples: 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

COVID VACCINATION UPDATE

Parishioners may appreciate knowing that all of parish staff, Andrew, Michele, Margaret and Hewina are all double vaccinated. At our recent Annual Diocesan Synod the following motion was passed: "That this Synod endorses the Archbishop's encouragement for all Christians to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 for the wellbeing of all individuals and the community (unless there are medical reasons vaccination cannot be received)." It is certainly the representative view of this church that there is nothing within the Christian faith to prevent us receiving vaccinations, and it is a practical way we show love for neighbour. Having said that there will be no discrimination against people on this basis other than what is mandated by our Government health directives.

CURRENT COVID RESTRICTIONS — UPDATED 23RD SEPTEMBER FROM SA HEALTH:

- 1. Check-in by QR code or on the slips of paper when attending.
- 2. Masks must be worn indoors for public events and areas, including worship. People who readings and preaching may remove them when presenting. Singing can take place but masks must be worn.
- 3. Please maintain 1.5m social distancing where possible.
- 4. Masks may be removed for receiving communion. Please sanitise your hands prior to receiving and observe 1.5m social distancing when queuing.
- 5. Masks may be removed for morning tea, (must be seated for over 50% capacity)

It's always great to welcome visitors to our churches at St Peter's, Glenelg and St Martin's, Glenelg South.

At 7:45am (St Peter's) you will need this news sheet and a green prayerbook (p.119). At 8:45am (St Martin's) you will be greeted with a news sheet, prayer & hymnbooks to use. At 10am (St Peter's) you only need this news sheet as the service is on the powerpoint screen.



Feel free to sit anywhere - there are no specially reserved seats.

Toilets are located, at St Peter's, along the passageway, under the projector screen. At St Martin's, they are in the corridor adjacent to the worship space.

Feel free to join in with all aspects of worship as you feel comfortable. Please be aware that visitors are warmly welcome to receive communion with us.

We love to meet new people so you are very welcome to stay for a cuppa after the service, but don't feel bad if you need to get away - there's always next time.

We hope you find inspiration and blessing in your time spent here.
