Advent Lighting Liturgy

Today as we light the third candle, the candle **JOY** we sing...

Prepare the way, prepare the way, A flame is burning bright. For Jesus Christ is coming The Way, the Truth, the Life

As we light the candle of joy, we remember the stories of God's loyalty to all creation.

We give thanks for the messengers — the apostles, prophets, artists, sages, faithful ones — present in every age, who bring us the good news of God's restoring love;

We rejoice and shout with joy, trusting that God is with us and before us, and that joy will be born anew in us.

Prepare the way, prepare the way, A flame is burning bright. For Jesus Christ is coming The Way, the Truth, the Life



Why a Pink candle? Pink is the color for joy!
A pink candle that signifies joy makes sense since it is lit on Gaudete Sunday—named for the entrance antiphon for the Latin Mass: "Rejoice (gaudete) in

the Lord always, again I say, rejoice."

As Advent is patterned in part after Lent, Gaudete Sunday is similar to the Lenten Laetare Sunday (Also called Refreshment Sunday or Mothering Sunday), which also represents joy and falls at the midpoint of Lent.

And that finally leads to the explanation for the pink candle. In the ancient Church on Laetare Sunday in Lent, the Pope gave a citizen a pink rose. Following the papal rose custom, bishops and priests began wearing rose-colored vestments on Laetare Sunday. The Church then brought the Lenten practice of rose vestments to Advent on Gaudete Sunday. As a result, the pink candle gained a place in the Advent wreath.

Although the culture tells us it's already Christmas, the Church reminds us through the pink candle of Advent that there is an appointed time for everything (Eccl. 3:1). The time now is for rejoicing—because the Lord is coming soon!



John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to

Abraham. Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.'

And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?' In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.' Even tax-collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.' Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should



we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.'

As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

For the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

PARISH STAFF COVID VACCINATION UPDATE

Parishioners may appreciate knowing that all of parish staff, Andrew, Michele, Margaret and Hewina are all double vaccinated. At our recent Annual Diocesan Synod the following motion was passed: "That this Synod endorses the Archbishop's encouragement for all Christians to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 for the wellbeing of all individuals and the community (unless there are medical reasons vaccination cannot be received)." It is certainly the representative view of this church that there is nothing within the Christian faith to prevent us receiving vaccinations, and it is a practical way we show love for neighbour. Having said that there will be no discrimination against people on this basis other than what is mandated by our Government health directives.

CURRENT COVID RESTRICTIONS – UPDATED 23RD SEPTEMBER FROM SA HEALTH:

- 1. Check-in by QR code or on the slips of paper when attending.
- 2. Masks must be worn indoors for public events and areas, including worship. People who readings and preaching may remove them when presenting. Singing can take place but masks must be worn.
- 3. Please maintain 1.5m social distancing where possible.
- 4. Masks may be removed for receiving communion. Please sanitise your hands prior to receiving and observe 1.5m social distancing when queuing.
- 5. Masks may be removed for morning tea, (must be seated for over 50% capacity)

CLARIFYING ADVICE RECEIVED RE:SINGING AND COMMUNION

SA Health has confirmed to the diocese the following advice. In summary **Singing**

Singing can still occur with services: but masks must be worn at all times. Masks should be changed if they become damp and/or also after the completion of singing. Bring spare masks with you and a bag to keep the used ones in. (Rev Michele has organised for a mask recycling bin for St Peter's and we are awaiting its arrival.) Use hand sanitiser before and after putting on or taking off a mask.

Communion

Those administering Communion should be masked. Their hands should be sanitised <u>after</u> handling masks as the last action before administering Communion. Those receiving Communion should keep their mask on whilst approaching the priest <u>and</u> whilst receiving. Once they [or the priest] have moved away from each other, only then should they briefly remove their mask to eat or drink the offering. Whilst cloth masks are great, and attractive, SA Health advise that the best protection is provided by Triple Layer Surgical Masks.

It's always great to welcome visitors to our churches at St Peter's, Glenelg and St Martin's, Glenelg South.

At 7:45am (St Peter's) you will need this news sheet and a green prayerbook (p.119). At 8:45am (St Martin's) you will be greeted with a news sheet, prayer & hymnbooks to use. At 10am (St Peter's) you only need this news sheet as the service is on the powerpoint screen.



Feel free to sit anywhere - there are no specially reserved seats.

Toilets are located, at St Peter's, along the passageway, under the projector screen. At St Martin's, they are in the corridor adjacent to the worship space.

Feel free to join in with all aspects of worship as you feel comfortable. Please be aware that visitors are warmly welcome to receive communion with us.

We love to meet new people so you are very welcome to stay for a cuppa after the service, but don't feel bad if you need to get away - there's always next time.

We hope you find inspiration and blessing in your time spent here.
