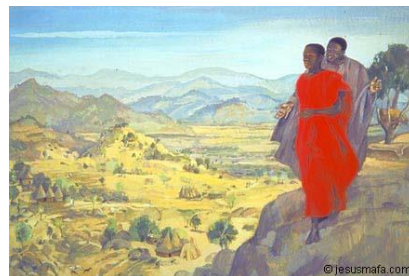

WORSHIP THEME: PRACTISE GRATITUDE

(THE WORD IS ON YOUR LIPS AND IN YOUR HEART)

Priest's Message

The verse that strikes me from this morning's gospel is the one immediately after our Gospel reading finishes! Verse 14 reads "Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee". The experience of temptation and testing in the wilderness actually strengthens Jesus and he is filled with the power of the Spirit.



Jesus shows that having God's word on his lips and in his heart is a strong defence against the temptations he faces (as St Paul's suggests in this morning's New Testament reading from Romans). In fact, Jesus will often return to deserted places during his ministry (cf Luke 4:42; 5:16; 6:12). Whilst we can be confronted by the experience of Jesus being tempted in the desert, it is clear that the desert is no longer a place of fear for Jesus, indeed it is a place of prayer and refuge that he returns to again and again to be strengthened by the power of the Spirit.

For us, the season of Lent can be that desert experience - a season to seek time to spend in prayer and silence; a time to have the Word of God on our lips and in our heart and be strengthened by the gift of God's Spirit.

First Reading

Deuteronomy 26.4-10

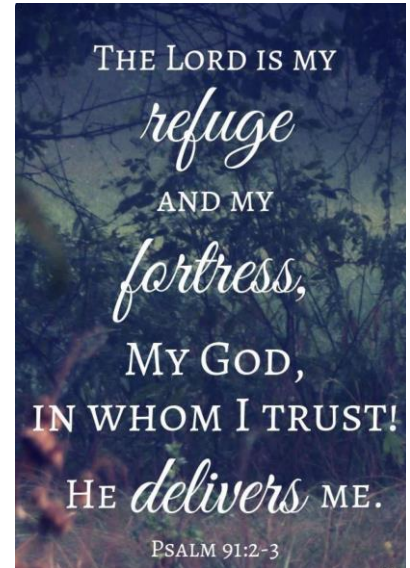
A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labour on us, we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression.

The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God.

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Second Reading

Romans 10.8b-13

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans

What does the scripture say? ‘The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart’ (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved.

The scripture says, ‘No one who believes in him will be put to shame.’ For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, ‘Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.’

Hear the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

✠ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing at all during those days, and when they were over, he was famished.

The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become a loaf of bread.' Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "One does not live by bread alone." '

Then the devil led him up and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And the devil said to him, 'To you I will give their glory and all this authority; for it has been given over to me, and I give it to anyone I please. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." '

Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, saying to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to protect you", and "On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone."' Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." '

When the devil had finished every test, he departed from him until an opportune time.
