
SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT SUNDAY 13TH MARCH 2022 WORSHIP THEME: GOD'S PROMISE

Priest's Message

In Luke 19:41 Jesus wept at the sight of Jerusalem and exclaimed: "If you had only recognised on this day the things that make for peace!" Jesus may well be saying the same thing over the Russian invasion of the Ukraine at present.

The church pictured to the right is the church of Dominus Flevit ("Jesus wept") on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem. Inside the church is a mosaic showing Jesus as a mother hen as described in our Gospel reading today (Lk 13:31-35 and also Matt 23:37-39).

The image of the protective mother hen is a strong nurturing image that endures meaningfully for us to this day. The latin words "et holvisti" under the mosaic can be translated as "and you hugged". We pray that our world,



and especially those under threat of violence and war at this time, may know the protective embrace of God. We pray also that we each may know God's embrace as we walk the journey of Lent.

Whilst mixed seating and standing is allowed for morning teas it does reduce our capacity for 84. However for larger gatherings that may exceed that number please endeavour to be seated for catering events as this will increase our community centre capacity to 126.

Feel free to sit anywhere - there are no specially reserved seats.

Toilets are located, at St Peter's, along the passageway, under the projector screen. At St Martin's, they are in the corridor adjacent to the worship space.

Feel free to join in with all aspects of worship as you feel comfortable. Please be aware that visitors are warmly welcome to receive communion with us.
