## **Priest's Message**

Palm Sunday is filled with hope and expectation. Even for us 21<sup>st</sup> Century Christians who know well the liturgical pattern of this week and the path that Jesus must walk, there is a sense of joining in with hopeful optimism of the plam-waving crowd. We too can shout: 'Hosanna, Lord



save us!' We too can shout: 'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!'

What were the crowds hoping for and expecting in Jerusalem that day? Liberation from the Romans? A peaceful existence? Enough for their families to live on? An overturning of unjust structures? Blessings from God?

What might we be clamouring for in our time? Peace in Ukraine? Freedom from the pandemic? A more inclusive society and church? Renewal in the church? Blessings from God?

Perhaps we can relate to Palm Sunday because like the people in the Jerusalem crowd that day we also grasp for a sense of hope and an expectation for the salvation of God. The crowd were to misunderstand the nature of Jesus' kingship and likewise we sometimes misunderstand what God is offering us. So perhaps the invitation of Palm Sunday as we enter Holy Week is to have expectant hearts but open minds. Open to what God has to teach us. Open to what God is calling us to. Open to a deeper sense of our vocation as Christians in this time and place. Perhaps communally we can pray *Speak Lord, your servants are listening. Amen.* 



## A reading from the book of Isaiah

The Lord God has given me the tongue of a teacher, that I may know how to sustain the weary with a word. Morning by morning he wakens - wakens my ear to listen as those who are taught.

The Lord God has opened my ear, and I was not rebellious, I did not turn backwards.

I gave my back to those who struck me, and my cheeks to those who pulled out the beard; I did not hide my face from insult and spitting.

The Lord God helps me; therefore I have not been disgraced; therefore I have set my face like flint, and I know that I shall not be put to shame; he who vindicates me is near.

## Second Reading Philippians 2:5-11 A reading from the letter of Paul to the Philippians

And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross.

#### **Gospel Acclamation**


#### Alleluia! Alleluia!

Gospel Luke 9:28-40

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ



Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, 'Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" just say this: "The Lord needs it." '

So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, 'Why are you untying the colt?' They said, 'The Lord needs it.' Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it.

As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, saying,

'Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!'

Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Teacher, order your disciples to stop.' He answered, 'I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out.'
