Priest's Message

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Our theme says it all. Christ IS risen, not "was risen" but is risen — for all time. The resurrection of Christ is a mystery. It can be a stumbling block to faith. We might get stuck on questions that start with the word "how..." and it is perfectly faithful to ask those questions. But in the end, we are not told in scripture how God did it, only that God raised up Jesus from the dead.

Repeatedly this statement is affirmed (cf Acts 2:32, 3:15, 3:26, 4:10, 10:40, 13:30, 13:37; Romans 10:9; 1 Corinthians 6:14). And that this event was the central point in the history of salvation.

Those of us who have participated in the Lenten reading guide through Luke-Acts will have perhaps been surprised that following the incredible ministry of Jesus there were just 120 believers who gathered in Jerusalem at Pentecost. This seems like such a small number of people. But these were 120 people who had experienced the death and resurrection of Christ. They had hope and only needed the Holy Spirit to inspire and strengthen them to take that good news to the world. The Story of the Acts of the Apostles is a story of how the Good News of resurrection, is spread through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. And the number of believers grew (Acts 1:15, 2:41, 4:4, 5:14, 8:12, 11:21, 9:31, 13:48-49, 14:1 are just a few references to how the church continually grew). In our context it seems hard to believer that such growth in faith could occur, although world wide the Christian church is still growing. But look what can happen when just 120 believers are inspired by hope.

Christ is risen! Alleluia! The God of life go with you!

The Risen Christ beside you! The vibrant Spirit within you!

This Easter and always. Amen.


Sentence

First Reading Acts 10.34-43

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter began to speak to those assembled in the house of Cornelius: 'I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him.

You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name.'

A reading from the first letter to the Corinthians

If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died. For since death came through a human being, the resurrection of the dead has also come through a human being; for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. The last enemy to be destroyed is death.

Hear the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Gospel Luke 24:1-12

★ The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women who had accompanied Jesus came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body.

While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and



bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest.

Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

UPDATED EASING OF COVID RESTRICTIONS

This information has come through the Leaders of Christian Churches SA and comes into effect for Good Friday onwards.

Checking in – <u>no longer required</u> to Check-in for services and events.

Masks - We are <u>no longer mandated</u> to wear masks although if you choose to wear them in worship or other crowded settings that is perfectly acceptable as well.

Hospitality – <u>all restrictions removed</u> as long as good infection control is in place. **Singing** – all restrictions eased.

Physical distancing – no requirement in churches although recommended where possible

COVID-safe plans – at this stage COVID safe plans will still be required to mandate infection control and to monitor over-crowding.

COVID Marshalls – At this stage COVID marshals are still required however the role is "to direct infection control and ensure community safety". We are uncertain what this means in practical terms. We will keep the roster in place for the timebeing but this role will probably revert to the priest's responsibility.

Communion – still being determined so we will continue as is for the time being. **Baptisms** – continue as is with no shared water for multiple baptisms.
